



DEVELOPING TALENTED ATHLETES IN WALES

The Welsh Player Pathway 2020/21

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the impact this has had on the playing of sport, the Hockey Wales player pathway has been adapted for the 2020/21 season.

For this season only, the pathway will have a slightly different look than previous years, with 360 centres remaining but these will feed into a 'Regional Performance Centre' (RPC)

There will be seven 360 centres operating, six in Wales and one in the South of England. Players who finished in a 360 in 2019/20 and want to continue in the pathway will begin in this tier, along with new players wishing to come into the Welsh pathway.

RPCs will operate out of 3 centres, Colwyn Bay, Swansea and Cardiff. All current National Age Group players and any players who finished the 2019/20 in the Aspire centres will train at one of these Regional NAG centres.

Players in 360 will be nominated into RPCs when they can consistently show the qualities required to thrive in a RPC and a potential to develop further.

The aim of 360

The 360 programme is a player development pathway, that aims to develop each person who attends to be the best hockey player they can be.

The 360 programme is part of pathway to playing National Age Group hockey for Wales. Any player wishing to represent Wales, must attend the 360 programme and achieve a nomination to the relevant RPC, before potentially being asked to attend the National Age Group Squad for an assessment period.

Entering the 360 pathway is the first step within the performance pathway. Individuals playing at clubs and schools can enter the system via self-nomination. Players will need to be in Year 8 at school / 13 years of age or turning 13 within the school year.

Once within the Welsh pathway players are developed holistically within the programme ensuring they are assisted with technical, tactical, physical and psychological development on a regular basis.

From first entering 360, individuals are then nominated, when ready, by the head coach through to the RPCs. This is completely individual dependent, ensuring players are progressed at the right speed/level.

Players can move through the pathway in either direction, depending on what is best for the individual's development, at any given time. This provides equal and individualistic chances to progress through the system, allowing the individual to unlock their potential.

The Welsh philosophy

Hockey Wales is a strong believer in a player centred coaching model, where the individual development of the player is put at the heart of everything we do. Working with GB Hockey we have developed a clear and consistent understanding of the key underpinning characteristics of world leading hockey players, which we call the 'End in Mind'

The 'End in Mind' identifies 5 key characteristics of world leading hockey players. Players that are highly skilled and creative, have a What it Takes to Win Attitude, are effective decision makers, can be self-organising and are fast and robust.

Using the GB Hockey 'Talent Development Framework' (TDF) as our guide, we are looking to develop players to be the best they can be and in turn, produce world leading players for our National teams. The TDF enables hockey coaches across Wales to provide players with a more systemic approach to optimising player development.

Player Engagement

Full engagement relates to how "engaged" a person is with the programme. To achieve your goals and to fulfil your absolute potential, full engagement is key. Coaches, managers and all other support staff will expect full engagement whilst a player is a member of any Hockey Wales performance programme.

This means a lot more than full attendance; it includes all the little things that are required to maximise your potential such as full attention during sessions and the work that you do away from the 360 Hockey Centre to name a few.

Going forward this will be continually monitored throughout the performance programme and players who are not fully engaged will be subject to a review with their coach.

Full engagement will ensure players are maximising their practice time and develop good habits that will assist in their journey as a performance player.

Strength and Conditioning

This year we will be continuing to support players with Strength and Conditioning (S&C) provision and support. Each player will be issued with a programme to follow at home. In addition, we have appointed a specific S&C lead, who will be the point of contact for all players regarding the S&C programme and will also be out visiting the centres to offer guidance and support, to help the players work through the S&C programme.

<u>Kit</u>

Outfield players must wear shin-pads and a left-hand protective glove, at all times when training. Wearing a gumshield is also highly recommended.

Players must wear appropriate kit for training.

Player Releases

Our aim is to keep 'as many as we can, for as long as we can', however players need to be working at an appropriate level and have the right attitude towards the programme.

If a player is continually falling below the expectations set by the centre Head Coach, a player could be released from 360Players need to continually show they are progressing and developing against the 'End in Mind' characteristics in order to maintain their place within the programme.

Players will be released from the 360 programme, if the Head Coach feels it is not the right environment for that players hockey development, at this point. If this happens, written feedback will be given a refund based on the number of sessions remaining in the block of activity will be issued.

Finance

The cost for attending a 360 Hockey Centre is £120. For those who have paid in full there is no further action you need to take. For those who paid a chosen amount or the deposit, we will be in touch shortly with instructions on how to make the final transaction. Please get in touch if you have any issues regarding the payment.

Any player nominated from 360 into RPCs will be asked to pay additional fees relating to the sessions they attend at RPCs. This is due to the contact time players receive at RPCs being more than that of a 360 player. The total cost for any player nominated into an RPC will not exceed an additional contribution of £30 max.

<u>Failure to make these payments will result in your child being unable to attend / removed from the programme.</u>

Terms and Conditions

- Please attend all sessions and bring your ticket along to show your Head Coach at registration.
- At all sessions you must follow relevant, local Covid restrictions. Your Coaches will do their best to provide the safest environment for you to continue progression whilst keeping the wellbeing of both players and Coaches safe.
- Track and Trace is Mandatory at all sessions.
- If you or anyone in your household develops symptoms of Covid-19 please follow Government Guidelines.
- If anyone who has attended your 360 / RPC session develops symptoms of Covid-19, you will be notified. Please follow the guidelines stated by the Government for those who have come into contact with someone who has developed symptoms.

- Attendance at all sessions is essential, if for any reason you cannot attend your session please inform your Head Coach with a minimum of 48 hours' notice. The only exception from this is if you develop symptoms of Covid-19 within the 48-hour period. We hold the rights to release you from your RPC or 360 Centre if your attendance rate is low.
- If for any reason a session is cancelled, you will be informed via email. Where possible we will try hold further sessions in early summer to make up for any cancelled sessions, where this is not possible, we will result to credit notes and refunds.
- For those whose age permits them to remain in the Pathway for the 2021-22 season, you will receive credit on your account for any sessions cancelled by Hockey Wales for the following season, resulting in a lower fee to be paid. The credit note value will be determined by the number of sessions cancelled and you will be notified of the value by the end of the 2020-21 season.
- Anyone who is due to exit the pathway or chooses not to remain in the pathway at the end of the 2020-21 season, you will receive a refund. The value of the refund will be dependent on the number of sessions missed.
